Take time to consider the man who was the first President of the United States and how his belief in religious freedom helped build the foundations that we stand on.  Old Town Alexandria Dating back to 1749, Alexandria's riverfront was an important port during the Colonial, Revolutionary and Civil War periods. Old Town Alexandria is filled with cobblestone streets, historical homes, churches, museums, shops and restaurants.  Afternoon Departure Give thanks for all you have learned on your journey.
White House Photo Stop See the residence of every President in US history except George Washington (the house was not completed at the time). Stop for a moment and say a prayer for the current administration and all of those who preceded him.  National Archives Home to a vast and ever-growing multitude of documents and materials, the National Archives houses census data, military records and important historical documents such as the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States. You can reflect upon the words of our Founding Fathers when you visit here.
